Joe Henderson: Changing Hillsborough Commission makeup worth a look

Hillsborough’s charter, approved by voters 35 years ago, provides for seven county commissioners. Four of them represent a single district; three are chosen countywide. In 1983, when the referendum passed creating the current setup, the population was a little over 700,000. Today, it is 1.4 million and expanding rapidly. Sandy Murman argues that changing the commission makeup to single-member districts — and maybe expanding the board by two members — makes sense because the county is too large for anyone to effectively represent everyone. That point is worthy of discussion.

Tampa-Hillsborough makes list of top 40 for entrepreneurs
