In November, the Hillsborough County Commission and Tampa City Council voted to give Greenway a total of \$104,000 in local tax refunds. Florida's Qualified Target Industry tax refund program accounted for the other 80 percent of the incentive package. The new employees have already assumed work in Greenway's software development and training, legal, cyber security and marketing departments — jobs that pay an average salary of \$57,163.
