One of the most important decisions you will have to make is **“Should I Evacuate?”** If you are asked to evacuate, you should do so without delay. But unless you live in a coastal or low-lying area, an area that floods frequently, or in manufactured housing, it is unlikely that emergency managers will ask you to evacuate. That means that it is important for you and your family to **HAVE A PLAN** that makes you as safe as possible in your home. **Disaster prevention** includes modifying your home to strengthen it against storms so that you can be as safe as possible. It also includes having the supplies on hand to weather the storm. The suggestions provided here are only guides. You should use common sense in your disaster prevention. 5 Things to Know:

Here are five things you need to know about hurricane season:

1. Know your evacuation zone: Check the county's evacuation map to be sure of the zone.
2. Find your closest shelter: Check the county disaster guide.
3. Know where your pet will go: Hillsborough County has four pet-friendly shelters.
4. Mobile home residents have special rules.
5. Keep a list of emergency contacts.

Your Get Ready! Supply List:

Water – at least 1 gallon daily per person for 3 to 7 days

Food – at least enough for 3 to 7 days

- non-perishable packaged or canned food / juices

- food for infants or the elderly

- snack food / non-electric can opener

- cooking tools / fuel

- paper plates / plastic utensils

Blankets / Pillows, etc.

Clothing – seasonal / rain gear/ sturdy shoes

First Aid Kit / Medicines / Prescription Drugs

Special Items – for babies and the elderly

Toiletries / Hygiene items / Moisture wipes

Flashlight / Batteries

Radio – Battery operated and NOAA weather radio

Telephones – Fully charged cell phone with extra battery and a traditional (not cordless) telephone

Cash (with some small bills) and Credit Cards – Banks and ATMs may not be available for extended periods

Keys, Toys, Books and Games

Important documents – in a waterproof container or watertight resealable plastic bag

- insurance, medical records, bank account numbers, Social Security card.
