The missing link in Lighting owner Jeff Vinik's vision for Downtown Tampa is now under contract. Vinik's Strategic Property Planners (SPP) is buying the ConAgra flour mill near the site of Water Street Tampa, Vinik's planned \$3-billion redevelopment of the city's downtown.

[Mosaic picks Bank of America in downtown for headquarters](#)

Bank of America Plaza in downtown Tampa will be the new corporate headquarters of the Mosaic Company, the first Fortune 500 firm to relocate to the Tampa Bay area. The phosphate mining giant announced that it was moving its corporate offices from Minneapolis to Hillsborough County in May, but an exact location was not known. Banyan Capital, owner of the 42-story tower at 101 Kennedy Blvd., said Mosaic will rent 20,000 square feet on the 25th floor. The move-in date has not been announced nor has the number of employees who will work out of the space.

[Cross-Bay Ferry relaunched amid hope for something more](#)

The Cross-Bay Ferry returned to Tampa and St. Petersburg with plans to run Tuesdays through Sundays for the next six months, but organizers and local officials want something more far-reaching and regular. Organizers hope for 40,000 passengers between now and April 30. That's about what they got during a pilot project two years ago, but some things have changed since then.
